Visits to Denny Abbey





Denny Abbey is unique in that it is the only religious site in England to have been lived in by three different religious orders. Today it is an architectural jigsaw of windows, blocked doors and arches.

Throughout its life it has been occupied by Benedictine Monks, Knights Templar, Poor Clare Nuns and finished its life as a farmhouse. after the dissolution.

It would make an excellent local history study for KS2, KS3 or even KS4.
